

What is hospice?

Hospice is a philosophy of care that enables people to make decisions about their own care and comfort when cure is not an option. Directed by the individual, hospice offers a compassionate alternative — comfort care — for people living with advanced chronic illnesses and support for their families.

Most patients live in their own homes or the home of a relative or friend. Hospice of Michigan also cares for people who live in nursing homes, adult foster care facilities and assisted living facilities.

What do hospice volunteers do?

Here are just a few of the many ways volunteers serve:

GRIEF SUPPORT

- Calling or visiting bereaved families
- Assisting with support groups
- Helping with memorials or veteran ceremonies

ONE-ON-ONE SUPPORT

- Visiting with patients and families in homes and care facilities
- Visiting with veterans
- Staying with the patient while a family member takes a well-deserved break


ADMINISTRATION

- Data entry
- Organizing paperwork and filing
- Office support and special projects

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT

- Assisting at community events
- Educating the community about Hospice of Michigan

WHAT WE ASK OF VOLUNTEERS

- Complete an application, a background check form, and an interview
- Upon acceptance: complete fingerprinting and a TB test
- Attend the required basic training (6 hours), the additional training module(s) required for specific assignments (grief support, working with pediatric patients, etc.), and in-service and educational opportunities offered
- Make a commitment to accept an assignment each month
- Check off a form for every activity and submit it in a timely manner
